Enjoy this 7th edition of the Art of Ethiopia show and the passion of each artist.




Dear art aficionados,


ABERA ABREHA


ADDIS GEZEHAGN

EDUCATION: Amanuel Gebre Michael studied Fine Arts at the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design in 2005. He also graduated from the Teferi Mekonnen College, Department of Fine Arts, specializing in Painting in 2011.

CAREER: He has participated in a number of group exhibitions at venues such as the Taitu Hotel, the Golagule Tower, the Sheraton Addis, the Alliance Éthio-Française, the Laphto Mall, the National Theater and the American Embassy. He has showcased his work in a solo exhibition held at his own studio.

INSPIRATION: His paintings are inspired by the movements created by the climactic feelings of music and love combined together. He loves to use simple forms and mixture of plane forms and volume in his work of art.

NOW: Currently he works as a full-time studio artist in New York.



BEHAILU BEZABIH

EDUCATION: Behailu Bezabih is a multidisciplinary artist who was born in 1960 in Ethiopia. Behailu holds an MFA in New Media from the Transart Institute, Berlin and New York.

CAREER: He has held solo exhibitions at the National Museum of Ethiopia, the Irish Museum of Modern Art, Dublin, the Bag Factory South Africa, the Bowling Green State University, Ohio USA, the Goethe-Institute Berlin and Addis Ababa, the Alliance Éthio-Française, the Italian Cultural Institute, the Asni Gallery, the Lela Gallery and the Serenade Art House in Addis Ababa.



Since 2001 he has participated as an international resident artist in various countries and at various workshops, some of which are Egypt, New York Omi, the Bowling Green State University, Ohio, Dublin, Ireland, South Africa, Senegal, Kenya, Uganda, France and Germany.

INSPIRATION: Behailu finds inspiration from a mix of traditions and contemporary phenomenon. He brings various elements and experiences from society, politics and history into his work.

NOW: Currently he works as a lecturer at Alle School of Fine Arts and Design at the Addis Ababa University.



BISRAT SHIBABAW

EDUCATION: Bisrat Shibabaw was born in Addis Ababa in October, 1965. After finishing her high school, Bisrat studied for her Diploma at the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design. She completed her Master's degree at the St. Petersburg Academy of Arts in Russia.



CAREER: She has displayed her work at numerous solo exhibitions, at venues such as the Alliance Éthio-Française and the Lela Art Gallery. She has also participated in several group exhibitions around the world. Besides being showcased at numerous local venues, her work has also been exhibited at the Harn Museum of Arts, USA (2007), as well as in China and France.

INSPIRATION: Bisrat draws inspiration for her work from music, poems, folk stories and nature. She is also inspired by the world of toys, for she sees in them a reflection of human behavior.

NOW: Works as a part-time artist.



DANIEL TAYE


EDUCATION: Daniel Taye was born on 5th January, 1968. He studied painting at the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design, and graduated with distinction in 1990.



CAREER: He worked with the Ministry of Mines and Energy from 1991 till 1993. This experience provided him with a wealth of material for his paintings and also started his preoccupation with the human condition. Many of his canvasses have captured the changing faces of Addis Ababa. His art has been exhibited in numerous galleries throughout Ethiopia, as well as in the National Museum, the Goethe Institute and the Italian Cultural Institute. His work has also been showcased internationally in Holland and the United States of America.

INSPIRATION: In his works Daniel tries to capture the changing face of Addis Ababa. Daniel's work readily draws from the concept of reality and appearance which he showcases in his paintings of shadows, locked doors, nails on chairs, mousetraps on beds, etc.

NOW: He currently works as an artist and resides in Addis Ababa.



DAWIT ABEBE

EDUCATION: Dawit Abebe was born in Addis Ababa in 1979. As a kid he was passionate about art. He graduated from the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design in 2001.

CAREER: Dawit's work has been showcased at several solo and group exhibitions, at venues such as the Alliance Éthio-Française, the Lela Art Gallery, the Habesha Art Studio and the French Embassy. He has also been involved with several multicultural artists' residencies and has worked on projects organised by UNICEF and UNFPA. Dawit held solo exhibitions for his art at the Alliance Éthio-Française in 2009, and in Paris in 2010. His work is part of the permanent collection at Saatchi Art Gallery in London where he has also held a feature exhibition.

INSPIRATION: His preferred method of working involves letting images flow from his subconscious, be it flowers, clocks, women or scenes of life. His art is inspired by dreams. The inspiration for his work comes from stories, some fleeting moments, social, political and human interactions.

NOW: Since 2001, Dawit has worked as a full-time studio artist at the Habesha Art Studio.



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DESTA HAGOS

EDUCATION: Desta Hagos studied at the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design and became the first female artist to hold a solo exhibition while still a student. She graduated with distinction in 1969 and left to pursue higher studies at the California Lutheran University in the United States of America. After completing her Bachelor's degree in 1973, she returned to Ethiopia.

CAREER: Desta worked for the Ethiopian Tourist Organisation for 10 years before moving to the Ethiopian Tourist Trading Enterprise, where she became the Head of the Artistic Activities Department. She has given several solo and group exhibitions throughout Ethiopia as well as in Djibouti, Canada, Denmark, Kenya, Korea and the United States of America. Truly a fountain of feminine pride, she earned the distinction of being the first female artist to have her work purchased by the Ethiopian National Museum, by the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of Alexandria, Thiodor the 2nd, and by the Sheraton Addis.



ACCLAIM: As Ethiopia's leading female contemporary artist, Desta's work has earned her international fame. Her paintings are eagerly sought after by local and international art collectors alike, and they have been displayed at venues such as the California Lutheran University, the United Nations, the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), the Sheraton Addis Hotel, Tigray, the Bahir Dar Museum, the National Museum in Addis Ababa, as well as in Spain and Denmark. In 2014 she was honoured with Lifetime Achievement Award in Art Tribute by Capital Hotel.

NOW: Today she owns a studio where she works full-time and makes plans for her future exhibitions.



EMANUEL TEGENE


EDUCATION: Emanuel Tegene was born on 29th August, 1985 in Ethiopia. He received fine arts training at the Alle School of Fine Arts and Design.

CAREER: Emanuel started his career in 2009 as a cartoonist for Saloon Ethiopia. He later worked on various projects, from creating movie storyboards to book covers. Emanuel showcased his first works for Art of Memory at the Italian Cultural Institute. Since then he has participated in various events and exhibitions that include Café Town at the National Gallery, Chewata at the Italian Cultural Institute, the AU Golden Jubilee Art Exhibition at the Sheraton Addis and the African Aesthetics celebrating the AU at the Addis Ababa University, Institute of Ethiopian Studies Museum. He had a solo exhibition, 'Angels and Demons' at Alliance Éthio-Française and another at Galani Cafe.

INSPIRATION: His work brings out a beautiful relation that we, as people have with numbers. He believes whether we are inquiring into the past or trying to understand the present and future, numbers play an essential role.

EPHREM SOLOMON TEGEGN


EDUCATION: Ephrem Solomon Tegegn was born in Addis Ababa in 1983. After finishing high school he joined an art school to pursue his interest in art. In 2009 he completed a diploma in Fine Art and Graphic Arts at the Entoto TVET College in Addis Ababa.

CAREER: Since participating in his first group exhibition at the Russian Center for Science & Culture, Addis Ababa in 2002, Ephrem has presented his work at various national and international exhibitions that include the Contemporary African Art and its Caricature 2013 at the Ichono Yakata Gallery Yokohama City University, Japan, (DUCTAC), Dubai in 2011, the 2nd International Biennial of Painters and Sculptors, Croatia in 2010, and the Italian Culture Institute Addis Ababa (CHEWATA) The Game of Life, Ethiopia in 2013. In 2012 he had his first solo exhibition at Le Rustique Exhibition, Nairobi, Kenya. In 2014 he had another solo exhibition - 'Untitled Life in London.'



INSPIRATION: Ephrem finds inspiration from the sociopolitical aspects of human life and nature. His work is based on his personal experiences as well as his visions of future. Although his work can be described as based on realistic themes, yet his aims never stay fixed. Sometimes his paintings are unapologetically descriptive of what is immediately around him. He employs black and white colors to describe various aspects of life.

His process of production involves walks in the city where he observes people and their relation to the space around them.



ERMIAS SHIBERU

EDUCATION: Ermias Shiberu was born in Ethiopia in 1977. He attended the Addis Ababa Technical School where he received a Diploma in Drafting in 2002. In 2003, he completed a certificate in Design and Fine Arts through an Extension Program from the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design.



CAREER: Ermias has participated in different group exhibitions held at the Alliance Éthio-Française, the American Embassy, the Juventus Club Group Exhibition with Spanish artists and the Unity University. He has also worked as an Interior Designer and Decorator for various hotels and organizations.

INSPIRATION: Ermias always wanted to become an artist. The love for art runs in his blood. He is inspired by the works of legendary Ethiopian artist Afowerk Tekle. He loves working on natural objects like wood and stones. He decided to become an artist after reading Michelangelo's and Leonardo Da Vinci's books.



FITSUM WUBESHET

EDUCATION: Born in 1981, Fitsum Wubeshet is a self taught artist based in Addis Ababa. He studied painting and sculpting at Master Fine Arts School and Abyssinia Fine Arts and Vocational School.



CAREER: He started his career in 2001 serving as a cartoonist at different newspapers and magazines where he was recognized for his captivating and contemporary work on economic, political and social issues. Apart from his successful career in art journalism, he has been aggressively engaged in painting since 2004, as a result of which he has succeeded in staging many solo and group exhibitions on various silent themes, which have become his hallmark. His most recent works were displayed in the 201 "Art of Ethiopia" exhibition that was held at the Sheraton Addis and at Sidama Lodge in Addis Ababa.

INSPIRATION: Evolving through different themes, his recent works reflect comparable elements of Addis Ababa and the urban lifestyle transition and its multi-faceted impact on social and economic dynamics. Fitsum has also proved his talent by depicting practical realities in metal art other than painting.

NOW: He is currently a full-time studio artist in Addis Ababa.



GASHAHUN KASSAHUN


EDUCATION: Gashahun Kassahun was born in 1980 in Woliso, Ethiopia. He joined the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design and graduated in 1999. He also graduated from the Teferi Mekonnen College, Department of Fine Arts, specializing in Painting in 2011. Apart from academics, he has been working as a full-time studio artist.

CAREER: Gashahun has participated in many group art exhibitions and has also showcased his work in solo exhibitions. Some of the exhibitions he has participated in include the City Hall in 2000, the Russian Cultural Institute in 2005, the Ethiopian National Theater Art Gallery in 2007, the Daberhan Art Gallery (Duka Millennium Exhibition) in 2007, the Hellenic Athletics Association - Greek Club in 2007, the E.C.A. (Economic Commission for Africa) in 2008, the National Theater Art Gallery organized by the Addis Development Vision in 2011 the Sheraton Addis in 2012 and 2013, and the Ethiopian National Museum in 2014.

INSPIRATION: Gashahun was recently inspired by and concentrated his work on the cycle of transforming spirit to form and form to spirit. In addition to his past experience and knowledge of shapes and colors, he enjoys constructing a generalized form with colors. With a knowledgeable and reasonable attitude, he follows his personal feelings that enable him to create unique art.

GETAHUN ASSEFA

EDUCATION: Getahun Assefa studied Painting and Graphics, majoring in Sculpture at the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design, and graduated with distinction in 1987. He then moved to Russia's Moscow State Academic Institute of Fine Arts in 1989, where he specialized in Monumental Painting (Mural Art) and completed a Master of Fine Arts degree with honours in 1995. He also learned 2D and 3D Computer Graphic Design during his time in Russia.


CAREER: In June 1997, he began working as the Head of the Arts and Crafts Department at Ethiopian Television. He then moved to the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design in 2001, where he became Head of the Monumental Painting Department, a subject he also taught full-time. He created one of his signature sculptures for the interior of Wolayta Sodo Town in 2005. It was made with a combination of mosaic work, graffito, gypsum decoration and photographs. He created another large scale monumental sculpture for the exterior of the Sidama Cultural Hall in Awassa Town, which combined mosaic work and digital artwork.



ACCLAIM: His works have graced numerous exhibitions around the world, while some are still kept on display in Moscow and Addis Ababa. His art is also a part of many private collections in Ethiopia, Austria, England, Italy, Panama and the USA. He has created a 14m heroic sculpture and a 26m monument with mosaic art in Hawass city.

INSPIRATION: Getahun finds inspiration from natural surroundings and handicrafts. It is the stories conveyed through these that pushed him on the path of art. Whether his mood is joyous of melancholic he expresses it through his paintings. He believes in the spirit of humanity that brings people together in good and bad times.

NOW: Works as a part-time artist.



GIZACHEW KEBEDE

EDUCATION: Gizachew Kebede completed his formal art education at the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design and graduated with distinction in 1994. He then undertook two more years of training in the field of Painting and Mural Art, graduating once again with distinction.

CAREER: He has participated in more than 40 art exhibitions in Ethiopia and other countries such as Ireland, South Africa, Tanzania and the USA. One of his paintings, titled 'Fighting with the Self' is on display at the Ethiopian National Museum.

INSPIRATION: Gizachew was born and raised in a rural area abundant with natural beauty and fresh air, and these all inspired him to become an artist. The changing seasons, the subtlety of natural phenomena, the culture and the traditions all find their way into his work. His artistic expression is based on a belief that art and culture is a living memory of what humans have achieved and a path towards reaching the inner knowledge of what our future could be. He is also inspired by the works of well known artists like Worku Goshu, Tedesse Mesfin, Chagal, Pollock and Kandinsky.





HABTAMU TIBEBE



EDUCATION: Habtamu Tibebe was born in Addis Ababa in 1990. He attended high and preparatory school in GCA. He further went on to join Alle School of Fine Arts and Design at the Addis Ababa University to pursue his degree in graphics designing.

CAREER: In 2012 he participated in the Art Work competition presented by UNFPA at the Sheraton Addis. As a young and upcoming artist, his work has featured in major Ethiopian art galleries such as the National Theater Art Gallery, Art Galley of Alle School of Fine Arts, National Museum Art Gallery, to name a few.

INSPIRATION: He was one of the few artists who participated in a documentary that was conducted by Norwegian artists. He seeks inspiration in the patterns of butterflies, history, especially of his country and he loves to capture human faces in different hues.

NOW: Currently he works as a full-time studio artist.

NOW: Joseph currently works at the Russian Center for Science and Culture (RCSC) in Addis Ababa.




KEBREAB DEMEKE

EDUCATION: Kebreab Demeke was born in Addis Ababa. He majored in Painting at the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design from 2006 – 2010. He was a founding member of the Niten Art Studio in 2007 and the 41 Art Studio in 2010.

CAREER: His work has been exhibited at the Makush Art Gallery, Addis Ababa in 2007, the Listro School of Fine Arts and the Design Gallery, Addis Ababa in 2008, and at an art residency programme in Dire Dawa in 2011.

INSPIRATION: Regarding his artistic process, he says, "As I have grown as an artist, my work has become more and more an essential part of my being. I am inspired by color rather than subject matter, as it is extremely effective in arousing feeling and emotion. I want my audience to be immersed in color and shape and from there create their own reality. My abstract work can be seen as whatever the viewer perceives it to be. Each piece then becomes a unique interpretation of each individual's perception. My art work represents the southern part of Ethiopian people, their lifestyle and various aspects of their way of life. I believe my art space is in the society. The artist is far from society and at the same time lives inside the society. As an artist, I deal with different kinds of unexpected realities and difficulties. I also experience jubilation and harmony. Creating art helps me explore the relationship between people and their surroundings. My art helps me to expose my feelings, thoughts, emotions and imagination. My inspiration comes from everything I observe therefore; my art is not limited to specific style or theme. I work with different types of subjects and media. I use art as a weapon to express my thoughts about social issues. The components of my art are freedom, discipline, and energy."







KERIMA AHMED

EDUCATION: Kerima Ahmed was born in 1977 in Ethiopia. She graduated from the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design in 2002. She holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Ethiopian Language and Literature.

CAREER: Since her graduation, she has participated in a number of group and solo art exhibitions held at various galleries, museums, embassies and cultural centers in Ethiopia, Djibouti, Sudan, Uganda, Austria, Holland and Germany. She contributed to establish Nubia, an artist group in Addis Ababa.

She held a workshop and exhibition at the Sudan University of Science and Technology, College for Fine and Applied Art in 2008. She also held solo exhibitions at the Harare Arthur Rimbaud Museum in 2005 and 2006, the Norm Maxwell Studio Gallery, Los Angeles, California in 2011, the 'C' Art Gallery, Seattle in 2012 and the Colombia City Gallery, Seattle in 2013.

INSPIRATION: Her work celebrates not only the values of Ethiopian people but humanity as a whole. She believes art is not bound by geography or language. The things that she paints come from the things that she sees and thinks about. The colors, lines, textures, forms in her paintings are usually driven by the mood and feeling she is experiencing at a particular point in time. She compares her art to music or poetry that has its own sound and melody. It has its own flow and creates visual music in the mind of the viewer.

NOW: Kerima is a full-time studio artist based in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.





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KIDIST BERHANE

EDUCATION: Kidist Berhane was born in Addis Ababa in 1982. After completing her high school, she joined The Addis Ababa School of Fine Arts and Design in 2001.

CAREER: After she completed her graduation in 2003, she began working as a studio artist. She has had many single and group exhibitions to her credit. Her paintings have featured in many major galleries in Addis and in international art galleries. She has featured in Habesha, St. George Art Gallery, and her work can be found in Dubai art galleries as well. Many collectors and individuals who have bought her paintings have given her encouraging comments and appreciation.

INSPIRATION: Her paintings mainly focus on the life and culture of the southern people of Ethiopia (such as the Hammer people), life of Ethiopian women in general, nature, beauty and environment. Her works originate from her observation of the moving events of life and her sole desire is to move people by her art.





KOHAR KEVORKIAN

EDUCATION: Kohar Kevorkian is an Armenian-Ethiopian artist who was born in 1976. She studied at the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design from 1995 to 1997, where she obtained a certificate in Art and Painting. She is also certified from the Regent Academy of Fine Arts in London. Kohar studied pottery-making in Armenia from 2008 - 2009, under the supervision of Mr. Samvel Baghdasaryan, Director of the National Centre of Aesthetics, Department of Fine Arts and Dean of the Armenian Open University.

WORK: She experiments with various art forms such as lamps, stools, home furnishings and tables, as well as with accent pieces like wooden sculptures, mirrors, candle holders, pottery, leather cushions, leather bags and different lighting designs. Her leather carpets and bags exhibit a workmanship that blends traditional and modern techniques, to produce stylish, contemporary and high quality products. Her signature piece of art is the classic African comb or 'Mido', which has attracted the interest of many art collectors and galleries.

CAREER: Since 2003, Kohar has displayed her work at five successful solo exhibitions (as well as at the AOE 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013 at the Sheraton Addis), with each show receiving rave reviews. Her unique art ranges from passionate paintings to 3D wall pieces, channeling what she sees into what she displays.

INSPIRATION: Her art conveys emotion, feeling, energy, feminism, colour and the importance of function. For the 2014 Sheraton Art of Ethiopia Exhibition, she is showcasing her latest creations of art and home accessories using recycled materials. Her inspiration to use recycled materials goes beyond her commitment to the environment. For her, recycling is a metaphor for rejuvenation, new beginning and beauty.

NOW: She currently engages in Interior Design and Decorating with her sister through their company "Final Touch."





LEAYNE TILAHUN

EDUCATION: Leayne Tilahun is an Ethiopian artist whose work encompasses a wide spectrum of subjects. He received his Bachelor of Arts Degree from the Addis Ababa University, Alle School of Fine Arts and Design.

CAREER: Leayne's work has been showcased in various solo and group exhibitions. He had his first solo exhibition in 2009 at the Red Cross Hall, Dessie, Ethiopia. He has also participated in a number of group exhibitions held at venues such as the Red Cross Hall, Dessie, the Open Air Exhibition, Dessie, the Ambaras Hotel, Dessie, the Roha Hotel, Lalibela, and the Alle School of Fine Arts and Design.

INSPIRATION: Leayne's take on art is reflected in his own words, "Having grown in a town where horses and horse driven carriages are abundant, one could easily get fascinated by this scenery that comprises an elegantly proportioned creature and complex accessories that range from ropes and wood to metals and leather. I strive to project my feelings on the subject that I believe is visually strong, by employing well thought of draughtsmanship and arrangement, along with expressive yet reserved distortion".





LEYKUN WONDIFRAW



EDUCATION: Leykun Wondifraw was born on 6th September, 1988 in Addis Ababa. He graduated with distinction from the Addis Ababa University, Alle School of Fine Arts and Design in 2011.

CAREER: His work has been showcased at various group and solo exhibitions such as at the Alle School of Fine Arts and Design, the Alliance Éthio-Française, Radisson Blu Addis Ababa, Lafto Art Gallery and the National Museum of Ethiopia.

INSPIRATION: His themes are mainly focused on reflections. His work depicts his imagination of the changing seasons, especially summer. Leykun gives his audiences a feel of seasons, cityscapes as seen from the inside of a car.

NOW: He currently works as a full-time studio artist at the Ethiopiawi Art Studio.



LULSEGED RETTA

EDUCATION: Lulseged Retta, one of Ethiopia's illustrious artists was born in 1952. His life and work have featured in various national and international publications over the years. He received a Diploma in Painting from the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design. He continued further studies at the Academy of Art in Repine, St. Petersburg, where he completed his Master of Fine Arts Degree with great distinction in 1986.

CAREER: From 1977 to 1979, he worked as a Stage Designer and as the Head of the Art Section at the Hager Fikir Theatre. In 1987, he was made the Head of the Artistic Activity Department at the Ethiopian Tourist Trading Enterprise. Additionally, in 1995, he became a Senior Artist for Production (Technical Division) and the Head of the Commercial Art Department. He stayed there until 1996, and then decided to become a full-time studio artist. Lulseged seeks to bring a modern approach to traditional Ethiopian painting. The product of this vision - his work, has been displayed at numerous venues in Addis Ababa, St. Petersburg, Moscow, Washington DC, Florida, Los Angeles, Osaka, Djibouti, Geneva, Cairo and Johannesburg. Lulseged has been working with the Art of Ethiopia team since 2008.

ACCLAIM: Some of his works are permanent features at the Academy of Art in St. Petersburg and the Sheraton Addis. His art also features in many private collections worldwide. INSPIRATION: Lulseged was attracted by the works of two of Ethiopia's most famous artists - Gebre Kristos Desta and Matre Afrewerk Tekle.





MEKASHA ETEBO

EDUCATION: Mekasha Etebo was born in Addis Ababa in 1991. He completed his high school from Zeway High School. Due to his close association with fellow artist Tamerat Georgis he was able to grasp more about art and techniques. After completing his school, he joined Alle School of Fine Arts and Design in the year 2010.



CAREER: In just his second year of art school he participated in a student exhibition, which was held at an art school gallery for which he received positive feedback. Post this encouragement he participated in many group exhibitions such as the ones held in Conso Cultural Museum and Ethiopia National Museum. In his final year, he participated in a group exhibition titled Art Meets Fashion at Golagol Tower that was presented by Mercy Décor and Modeling School.

INSPIRATION: He is inspired by the Ethiopian alphabet. His work highlights the different shapes and character of letters. The purpose behind his work he believes is to promote Ethiopia and to make the Ethiopian alphabet an icon of Ethiopia.



MERIKOKEB BERHANU

EDUCATION: Born in Addis Ababa in 1977, Merikokeb is one of Ethiopia's most contemporary artists. She enrolled herself at the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design and graduated with a Diploma in 2002.

CAREER: After her studies, she initially worked as a makeup artist at the Hager Fikir Theatre for a year. Over the next ten years, her works were displayed at numerous venues such as the Alliance Éthio-Française, the Addis Ababa City Hall, the National Museum, the Lela Art Gallery, the Bulgarian Embassy and the Nubia Visual Art Studio. She also conducted a workshop and an exhibition at the Sudan University of Science & Technology, College for Fine and Applied Art in 2008, and went on to hold another art exhibition in Djibouti in 2009 and at the Talisman Gallery in Addis Ababa in 2011.



ACCLAIM: She has been commissioned several times for artworks to commemorate specific events. Her alma mater is also known to display her art during various programmes. She created a street painting in Meskel Square with a 'Stop Early Marriage' theme, to commemorate International Women's Day.

INSPIRATION: Merikokeb communicates through forms, lines and arrangements that visually bring alive her feelings and thoughts. She wants viewers to interpret her images in their own way. The life that we are passing, the complication, the density, the crowd, the smoke, happiness and hope entice her and cause the inner section that leads to her art.

NOW: Having experimented with a variety of art forms, she now works as a studio artist.



MEZGEBU TESEMA


EDUCATION: Mezgebu Tesema is an Ethiopian artist who was born in 1960 in the Northern Shoa Administrative Region of Ethiopia. He attended the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design and later went on a scholarship to Repin Academy of Painting, Architecture & Sculpture in St. Petersburg, where he received his Master of Arts degree.

CAREER: Coming back from St. Petersburg, Mezgebu became an Art Instructor for Painting and Drawing at his former alma mater. In 1996, he began what would be a 7 year stint as the Head of Painting Department at the Addis Ababa University. The Japan Foundation to the 'African Art Symposium 2001' made him a 'source person' for study programs in Tokyo, Yokohama, Kyoto and Hiroshima, providing him the opportunity to tour Japan. While his work has been mixed with others in local exhibitions, he also held solo shows at the National Museum and the Alliance Éthio-Française. His work has also been showcased in China, Germany, Russia and the United States of America.

INSPIRATION: Living in the countryside allowed Mezgebu to develop a certain kinship with nature. The freedom of living in the lap of nature inspired him to paint. He supports the use of pictorial space in painting. He is always trying to achieve the intensified pictorial space in his art works. He believes the 3D quality of a painting is supported by pictorial illusion of space, it becomes more communicative and interactive with any spectator, looks stronger and possesses an engaging power.

NOW: Works at the School of Fine Art and also as a part-time artist.





MULUKEN DEBEBE

EDUCATION: Muluken Debebe was born on 29th January, 1978 at Metherara, Ethiopia. He completed his Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design, majoring in Painting.

CAREER: Muluken started his career as an Assistant Lecturer at the Entoto TVET College in December 2006 and continued to impart instruction there till September 2010. From September 2010 he has been working as Assistant Lecturer at EIABC (Ethiopian Institute of Architecture, Building Construction and City Development). He has participated in group exhibitions at various venues such as at the Annual Bazar Program of German church in Addis Ababa, the Alliance Éthio-Française, the Entoto TVET College, and the Sheraton Addis. He held a solo exhibition at the Alliance Éthio-Française gallery.

INSPIRATION: Muluken likes to teach people the importance of things, their usefulness and purpose through his paintings. For example he likes to paint horses and he explains the thought process as follows – "Horses are very useful for people but they abandon or discard them once they are no longer able to work. Through my work I want to show people the importance of horses and create respect for this beautiful creature."

NOW: He is currently working as an Assistant Lecturer at EIABC.





NIGATU SOLOMON

EDUCATION: Nigatu Solomon was born in the town of Dessie, Southern Wollo, in 1986. Growing up with an artist father he got acquainted with art at a very young age. Under his father's apprenticeship he had already developed a strong curiosity and passion towards art and art making before he joined the Pallet Art Center in 1997 to further develop his skills and get introduced to the academic way of art making.

CAREER: Nigatu has participated in various exhibitions and events at venues such as the Wollo Bahl Amba Hall in Dessie, the Red Cross Hall in Dessie, the 'Listro Exhibition' at the School of Fine Arts and Design with International Artists in Addis Ababa, the Alliance Éthio-Française in Addis Ababa and the Asni Art Gallery with the Network of Ethiopian Women's Associations in Addis Ababa.

INSPIRATION: Nigatu is inspired by the beauty of Habesha women especially in the context of a market under an umbrella and portrait. His works are done with fabrics of different sizes and shapes and overlapped in harmonious manner. The overlapping in turn gives the painting a peculiar tactility. Besides, the low relief formed by the overlapping gives the painting dynamism; as the direction of light changes many elements.





OUSMAN HASSEN MOHAMMED

EDUCATION: Ousman Hassen Mohammed was born on 20th April, 1986 in Ethiopia. He earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Industrial Design from Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design in 2008. He received practical training at DFAA for one year in the field of photography.

CAREER: Ousman has participated in various exhibitions that include the South Wollo Kombolca in 2007, group exhibitions at the German Goethe Institute and Gebre Kristos Desta Centre in 2008, at the National Theatre of Addis Ababa in 2009, at the Habesha Art Gallery in 2010 and at the Sidama Lodge Art Gallery in 2011.

ACCLAIM: Ousman has received awards and accolades from different art institutes. He was awarded a certificate and medal by the Ministry of Youth and Sports in the field of Fine Art, a certificate from Goethe Institute Gebre Kristos Desta Centre and a certificate of participation at Holeta Mosaic Art Festival.

INSPIRATION: His work of art concentrates on Ethiopian motifs, heritage and natural texture that he executes through the portraits of human beauty.

NOW: He has been teaching at the Addis Ababa University School of Fine Arts and Design in the field of Industrial Design and Graphics Design.



REDIET SISAY

EDUCATION: Rediet Sisay is an artist, craft & interior designer. She was born on 17th June, 1985 in Ethiopia. She received a certificate in Painting & Graphic Designing from the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design in 2006.

CAREER: She started her career as a Studio Artist in 2003 but in 2005 she started Redi's Collection. Her exhibitions include:

EDUCATION: Samuel Hailu is an Ethiopian artist born on 8th June, 1988 at Wolkite, Gurage Zone in Southern Ethiopia. In 2009, he joined the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design and graduated from the Department of Painting. In 2012 since the age of 15, Samuel showed interest in art activities, especially in painting. He devoted his time in these activities which resulted in successful results.

CAREER: His recent exhibitions include:

SEYOUM AYALEW

EDUCATION: Seyoum Ayalew is a contemporary Ethiopian artist whose art focuses on capturing real moments happening around him. He was born in 1968 in Addis Ababa. In 1981 he joined the Addis Ababa University where he graduated in Mural Art. After Seyoum's graduation he stayed in Dessie where he worked to promote art. As a result of his commitment to training young people he produced many young artists.

CAREER: Seyoum participated in the Art And Culture Panel at the World Economic Forum 2012. He has participated in several solo and group exhibitions in Ethiopia as well as other places across the world such as Djibouti, New York, Atlanta, Nigeria, Germany, England and China.



INSPIRATION: Seyoum's work is always focused on 'Tej Bet'. Tej Bet is the traditional drink house, a place where traditions, cultures, friendships mingle beautifully. The fact that Tej Bet has been there since the birth of Ethiopia and the drink (Tej) is favored by most Ethiopians inspired Seyoum to bring it back to its past glory. Inside his art Seyoum illuminates the relationship between light and shadow by contrasting the warmth and power of light through hot and cool colors with cool and hot colors. He works towards resolving conflict and tension between these themes through his use of color and emotion.

NOW: Seyoum currently serves as President of the Ethiopian Visual Artists Association.



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TESFAYE ASEFA (TESFU)

EDUCATION: Tesfaye Assefa (Tesfu) was born in 1977 in Addis Ababa. He graduated from the Addis Ababa University, School of Fine Arts and Design in 1999.

CAREER: Tesfaye always had a deep love for art, and stayed dedicated to his choice of profession, always challenging himself and continuing to take part in group exhibitions at various cultural institutes from 1998 onwards. Since 2005, he has been instrumental in the designing and mounting of mosaic work and monumental sculptures in places such as the Wolayta Cultural Centre in Wolayta Sodo, the Sidama Cultural Hall in Hawassa, the Saint Mary's Church in Addis Ababa and the Listro Project at Addis Ababa University. 
TIZITA BERHANU




